Increasing Access to Medicines Implementation Programme

\$600 million for medicines over four years

\$38 million to support delivery in 1st year potentially

\$188 million over four years

New medicine indications in 2024

New medicines

- 26 cancer medicine
- 28 non-cancer medicines

Start in 2024

- Pembrolizumab/Keytruda access widened for five indications 1 October
- Nivolumab/Opdivo, one additional indication 1 November
- Two antifungal medicines widened 1 Oct

Pharmac consulting on the next round:

- 13 other treatments, includes 4 cancer and 6 non-cancer
