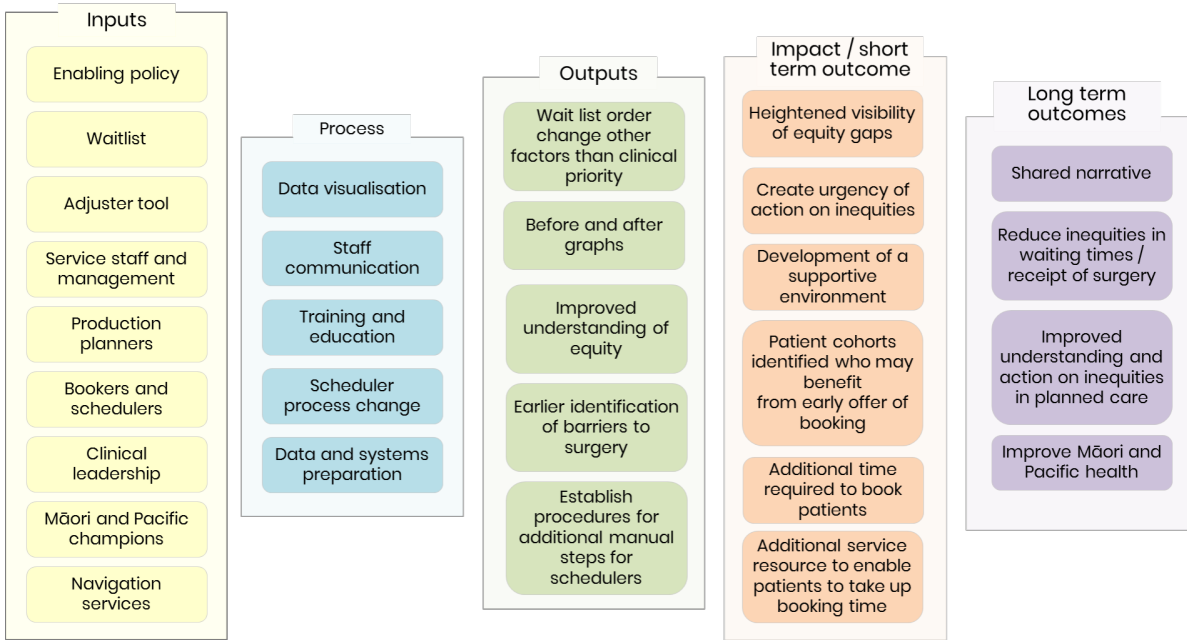
Appendix 7: Potential intervention logic

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As part of the evaluation the Review Panel developed a potential intervention logic based on interviews with key stakeholders and findings from the review. The Panel note that this is hypothetical, or best practice, for future tool

redevelopment, as there was not an existing intervention logic (or associated measurement) or sufficient clarity on some parameters to establish one as a framework for the evaluation.
